
KS2 Statutory Attainment 2024

Pupils are assigned a category of performance, which represents whether they are working at the expected standard, below the expected standard or at greater depth in the expected standard.

These statistics cover the attainment of year 6 pupils who took assessments in summer 2024. These pupils experienced disruption to their learning during the pandemic, particularly at the end of year 2 and in year 3. There were no assessments in 2020 and 2021.

The following data for has not yet been validated. When the DfE does this later in the academic year, we will update if required.

Progress Scores (KS1-KS2)

There are no progress scores for 2024 because the children did not take their KS1 SATs in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Average Scaled Scores

Scaled scores are used to report the outcomes of the SATs test, to ensure that the DfE can make accurate comparisons of performance over time as test questions vary year by year. A scaled score between 100 and 120 shows the pupil has met the expected standard in the test. The lowest scaled score that can be awarded on a key stage 2 test is 80. The highest score is 120.
