Did you know.....


- Worms have been around for over 600 million years.



This term year 3 had a trip in a time machine. Don't worry we followed the Time Machine safety guide. We headed back to the pre-historic period and enjoyed cave painting.












Throughout this term, we have been writing an adventure story based on the book 'Gorilla' by Anthony Browne. Children have thoroughly enjoyed the process of drafting their own sentences for a collaborative class version. They will now have the opportunity to write their own narrative based on the story – it's wonderful to hear children's fantastic thoughts and ideas.

During our Art lessons, we are also designing and creating our own illustrative narrative, where children can showcase their artistic skills to communicate a story. This year, we have also started Spanish lessons, where the children are showing great enthusiasm. They have learnt lots of fun facts about Spain and discussed the human features across the country. Children are also in the process of learning basic greetings in Spanish, which we are encouraging them to share at home.





Helping EYFS (Reception Children)

Recently Year 6 House Captains (8 people) have been given the opportunity to go to EYFS (Reception) and help the children get their belongings. We read stories, guide the children to collect their things and help with getting the right children to meet their adult and go home.
